What is Ascend & How Does it Work?



Ascend is Unbound's 3-year **leadership and professional development higher education program** that gives students a network and community for life, relevant, resume-worthy skills that will put them ahead in the job market, the opportunity to earn high-level certificates, and *(if they need it)* a college degree. Ascend does all of this while providing the freedom and flexibility for students to remain local, invest in their family and friends, and pursue jobs and other opportunities along the way.

As a **project-based education program**, Ascend equips you with the practical life skills, decision-making ability, and hands-on experience you need to be successful in life. As an **academic program**, Ascend provides relevant education options for non-degree, undecided, and degree seeking students through flexible, online academics.

More than anything else, Ascend is a **thriving community** and an **active training ground** — a place to meet exceptional people, build relationships that will last a lifetime (and beyond), and ultimately know that regardless of where you live or what life brings, you have people around you who will pray for you, support you, and be there for you no matter what.

Here's how it works.

When you enroll in Ascend, you will be assigned to an **Ascend Team**, a group comprised of 7-10 other Ascend students and led by a dedicated **Ascend Team Leader (ATL)**. Your ATL is another student or alumni who has successfully completed all of the elements of the first year of Ascend and has been intensively trained in coaching, leadership, and academic support. His or her job will be to help you and your other team members set and achieve your educational, personal, and professional goals for the year. You will meet with your team once a month via Zoom for coaching and support and also have daily access to your fellow team members, ATL, and greater Ascend class through our private chat platform, Slack.

If you choose the degree path option when enrolling in Ascend, you will be scheduled for an academic coaching call and receive a **Degree Plan**. Your Degree Plan is a customized strategy that reflects your higher education goals, the courses you need to take to achieve those goals, and when you will take those courses. Your Degree Plan will show you the courses and costs for your targeted college or university that will grant your degree and include instructions on how to transfer your credits when the time comes.

In August, your Ascend experience will kick off with the first live event of the year, **APEX**. Remember: Ascend is not a fully online program. There are three live events throughout the year that bring students together for in-person training, networking, and community building. Registration for all three events is included in your Ascend tuition and travel costs for the first event, APEX, are also covered.

APEX is our national conference, held in Lake City, Michigan during the second or third week of August. For year one students, APEX is an orientation not just to Ascend but also to the student community and Unbound as a whole. APEX is where you are first introduced to the key principles and relational culture behind Ascend. Here, the bar for the year is

intentionally set high — too high for you to reach it on your own. But through the connections you make with over a hundred other students and alumni, you have the opportunity to reach it together.

Each month in Ascend you will attend an **Expert-Led Webinar** and your **Ascend Team meeting**. The first meeting every month will be the Expert-Led Webinar. Attended by all Ascend students, these webinars provide opportunities for field experts to share their experiences and the lessons they have learned. You'll hear from intentionally selected speakers and have a chance to ask questions. These webinars give you the opportunity to see how what you are learning is successfully applied in the real world.

Your second meeting of the month will be with your own Ascend Team. In this meeting, you will discuss and apply the webinar content to your own life in practical ways and work with your ATL to set and achieve your educational, personal, and professional goals for the year. Your ATL will also be your first line of contact for questions and support over the next 10 months.

Following the APEX event, the first course you and your team will take in the Ascend program is Navigate. Navigate is a 16-week, non-accredited life course that runs from late August through early December. This course is designed to help young adults discover their life purpose and make wise decisions by asking the right questions, exploring their interests, and moving forward with confidence in their next steps. You will also start your first accredited course(s), depending on which enrollment package you chose, begin meeting regularly with your Ascend Team, and start brainstorming your Ascend Project.

What's the Ascend Project? This is your "capstone" for each year you complete in Ascend and teaches you how to make an idea a reality. These projects are as varied as they come, but there are a few common threads: students choose their own projects, which a) must be challenging and b) must incorporate lessons learned throughout the year. Past student projects have included illustrating a children's book, achieving business sales goals, starting a business, running a marathon to raise money for a charity, and building a canoe and taking a five-day river trip. Your project should be as unique as you are and challenging enough to meet your ambition and personal goals.

In January, the spring semester will kick off with **Basecamp**. Basecamp is typically held in Florida or Alabama towards the end of January. This event is a life skills intensive that focuses on key personal and professional skills that most people are aware of, but few make the most of. At Basecamp, you will learn to strategically manage your time and tasks, form exceptional relationship skills, and challenge your existing idea of resiliency. Basecamp is also an orientation to the execution phase of your **Ascend Project**.

As we said before, Ascend is a project-based education program, which means that it is all about helping you translate your academic and nonacademic studies into practical, actionable steps that equip you for life. Your Ascend Project is one of the most powerful ways you will do that. In the spring semester you will bring your Ascend Project to life and put your plan into action through four steps:

- 01** Attend Basecamp for your project orientation
- 02** Submit your project proposal to your ATL
- 03** Receive final approval for your project and begin executing
- 04** Submit three project status updates to your ATL in February, March, and April

As the spring semester begins to wrap up and you come to the midway point of your final classes for the year, you will attend the third and final event of the Ascend year: **Capstone**. Capstone is the culmination of the Signature Leadership Courses that all first year students complete and is held in the Colorado mountains. Your Signature Leadership Course instructor, Dr. Jeff Myers, will attend live, present several lectures, run a live coaching and mentorship practicum, and engage with students over meals.

Capstone is all about engaging with the leadership principles and practices taught in the Signature Leadership Courses at a whole new level. As you dialogue, wrestle with, and apply the concepts you've learned through the course series, you become better equipped to take these ideas home and do something new with them.

At Capstone, you're reminded of the lesson that no leader ever "arrives," and you'll create a plan that allows you to apply the "asking questions" framework you'll learn in Navigate to your life and influence as a leader. Capstone is the most academically challenging event in the Ascend year – but it's also an event that students consistently remember as life-changing.

In May, you will complete your Ascend Project with three final steps:

- 01 Complete a peer review and make all final edits
- 02 Submit your final project report to your ATL
- 03 Receive a final review and notes from your ATL

At the end of May or beginning of June you will close out your Ascend year by completing any final assignments for your courses and attending the final Ascend Webinar. For all students who successfully complete each aspect of the program, they will earn two high-level certificates in leadership and professional development. These certificates will set you apart from your traditionally educated peers and ahead in the job market. And if you continue on in Ascend? You will have the opportunity to earn an additional three certificates to highlight all the experience, training, skills, and education you have received through the Ascend program.

Each of the three years in Ascend builds on the previous in unique ways. Year One, Ascend Foundations, is described in this e-book. Year Two, Ascend Challenge, takes everything to the next level with three powerful life courses focused on cultural engagement, communications, and finances, leadership and internship opportunities, additional event tracks, and, if you pursue a degree path, continued college courses. And Year Three, Ascend Launch, does just that - bringing your Ascend experience to a powerful launching point as you either matriculate into your target school to complete your degree or step into the workforce with three years of relevant experience under your belt, a powerful community at your back, and high level certificates to validate all that you have accomplished in Ascend.


In summary, the entire Ascend Program is designed to teach you what you need to know about life and leadership through our Signature courses and Navigate. The Expert Webinars help you see how successful leaders have applied what they have learned in their own lives. Your Ascend Team will give you a community of people who will hold you responsible for maximizing your time in Ascend. The live events will teach you how to use what you have learned and apply it in a community setting. And your Ascend Project is where you bring it all together and demonstrate your skill in the real world.

When you finish your first year of Ascend, here's what will have happened:

- You will have made lifelong friends that you have traveled with, worked beside, and experienced some intense and deep times with.
- You will have completed your Ascend Project and achieved a significant personal goal.
- You will be equipped and trained to be exceptionally good at the basics of life: relationships, work, learning, and Biblical rest.
- You will have earned 9, 15, or 30 transferrable college credits.
- You will have earned the Signature Leadership Certificate. This is a credential that you can put on your resume and your LinkedIn profile. Employers who learn about this credential will receive solid information about your leadership skills and experience.
- You will have earned the Ascend Certificate. This credential will show potential employers and/or graduate programs your experiences and accomplishments in the Ascend program.
- You will have options for your life. You can choose to:
 - Stay in Ascend through Year Two or Year Three, keep earning college credit and/or building skills and experiences that will set you apart in the workforce.
 - Take your newly learned skills and experience and go straight to work, either for an employer or by starting your own business.
 - Transfer your credits to a school of your choice and complete your degree with that school.

No matter what option you choose you will have access to the Unbound and Ascend network and community for life.

What is Project-Based Education?



Ascend is a project-based education program, which means that the core of what we do is focused on helping you to translate your academic and nonacademic studies into practical, actionable steps that equip you for life. We believe you're called to greater things than most people settle for, that there are often better ways to learn those things than merely sitting in a classroom, and that your education should functionally equip you for a life of impact.

Well, all that sounds great...but what does it actually mean? What is project-based education?

Most colleges and universities are primarily academics-based. In a traditional college setting, the priority is to deliver the best academic experience possible. That's not necessarily a bad thing - particularly if your goal is to enter a professional field where intense academic preparation is necessary. This is most often (though not exhaustively) the case in careers in places like the medical field, the legal field, or the engineering field.

However, a significant (and increasing) number of career fields require less rigorous academic preparation and far more rigorous skills preparation. In fact, there are significant skills that most colleges or universities seldom touch - but that are inherently critical for success in today's professional world. And while academic simulations and book knowledge are great, there are times where stopping at the theoretical just won't cut it.

Because of this, project-based education avoids the theoretical as much as possible. It substitutes simulations with real-world experience and grounds academic knowledge in practical application. Throughout Ascend, you'll actively take the theories and ideas you're learning in your academic classes and apply them in real life. You'll do real projects, learning to turn ideas into reality, connecting with real professionals, and working with teams of people on some seriously ambitious ideas. You'll work on real skills in the real world. And you'll learn the tools, principles, and skills necessary to be exceptional in your generation.

Are you still going to take academic courses? Yes - absolutely! How many you take will depend on whether you are pursuing a degree-path, but either way, the academic component of your Ascend journey is not the end-all focus - your real-life application of that knowledge is. In project-based education, academics supplement and support the ultimate goal of college - to solidly prepare you for life.

Ascend Foundations Project Requirements

Every student must complete a given project challenge during the course of their academic year. Here is an overview of the Foundations Project Requirements.

To earn your first Ascend certificate, you must complete a personal project in the spring semester. This project will allow you to a) turn an idea from concept into reality, b) practically apply what you are learning in Ascend, and c) complete something personal, relevant, and meaningful.

Your Ascend Foundations Project must meet the following requirements:

- Your personal project should be a project where you apply the skills and knowledge you are learning in your classes and from the SME webinars. The project should be both personally challenging and personally rewarding.
- Your project can be an individual project or a group project. Your group can be your teammates, other students in the Ascend program, or with others who are not involved with Unbound.

Your project should be:

- Big and ambitious enough to move you out of your comfort zone.
- Difficult enough to require 8+ weeks of effort/work/preparation. Use this as a rough scale to judge difficulty.

There are a wide variety of options for your project. For example, your project could be:

- A personal challenge or goal. A personal challenge could be creative, physical, mental, or something else. Example: Write a book, run a marathon, or build a boat.
- A service project. A service project could be anything from a fundraiser to disaster relief to meeting a need in your community/sphere of influence.
- A business or entrepreneurial project. A business project could be anything from tackling a big project where you work, to starting a small business, to making a big goal in a business you have already started.

There are three phases to your Ascend Project:

1. Ideation and Proposal
2. Execution and Updates
3. Review and Submission

Your proposal, updates, project completion, and evaluation will be submitted to your team leader by given deadlines during the semester. Ultimately your project will allow you to use what you are learning in the program, give you new experiences or skills, and be challenging, stretching, and personally rewarding.



The Signature Leadership Courses

What is leadership?

For some, it evokes dusty board rooms where hours-long arguments take place, or bureaucratic ladders where one is pulled down so another can climb up. From building a deep personal leadership plan, to actively practicing and receiving mentorship and coaching, to engaging with powerful and timeless leadership principles at a new level, these leadership courses serve to support a new generation of Christian leaders – men and women who are prepared and equipped to lead in their spheres of influence.

And that's not all. In addition to nine highly transferable college credits, students who successfully complete all three courses earn the Signature Leadership Certificate, a powerful certificate backed by Summit Ministries that they can feature on LinkedIn, their resume, or provide to potential employers.

Course Titles & Descriptions

Leadership Theory & Practice - This is the first of three leadership courses that prepare students for culture-shaping leadership. Leadership Theory and Practice seeks to:

- Give students a thorough understanding of the history of leadership
- Prepare students to analyze their own leadership gifts
- Move students from theory to practice in effective leadership with practical life-management skills

Leadership & Management Communication - This is the second of three leadership courses that prepare students for culture-changing leadership. Leadership and Management Communication seeks to:

- Sensitize students to the importance of effective communication in leadership
- Equip students with organizationally useful communication skills
- Acquaint students with best practices for communicating effectively in leadership situations

Leadership Learning & Execution - Leadership Learning and Execution explores wisdom literature from Scripture, academic literature on wisdom, best practices for effective mentoring and coaching, and how to skillfully execute strategic plans — all with the objective of preparing students to put their leadership training into practice. Leadership Learning and Execution seeks to:

- Train students in the skills of mentoring and coaching
- Clarify the relationships between individual learning, organizational learning, and skillful execution of strategic plans
- Practice effective mentoring and coaching — both working with a mentor and mentoring others

Why certificates?

Because education is so, so much more than a college degree.

With everything you're learning, studying, practicing, and doing outside of your academics, you're also investing heavily in your personal and professional future. And we'd like you to get credit for that.

In fact, we'd love nothing more than for you to be able to share your accomplishments with your family, friends, future schools, or possible employers in a way that is straightforward and easy to understand.

With that in mind, we've built three years of Ascend Certificate - certificates that document and verify your unique accomplishments during your time in Ascend and present them in a powerful way. Students who complete all three years of Ascend also receive the ultimate Unbound Certificate, the highest honor Unbound currently accords.

Ascend certificates are tied to a unique badging system with both online electronic and physical components. Want to add your certification to LinkedIn or send it to a potential employer? Go right ahead. They'll be able to click on your badge and go straight to a site that verifies and describes all of your accomplishments during Ascend. Want to show off your physical certification? You'll receive your certificate at the completion of each year of Ascend.

What's even cooler is that these certificates stack. In other words, each year you're in Ascend is a year filled with new accomplishments, new projects, and new skills and experiences. Your certificates build on each other. But you can also step out of Ascend after any year, and you'll still have whatever certificates you have earned to that point.

So keep learning, with the confidence that the experience you're gaining will make a difference in your life - and will be recognized.

Ascend Foundations Certificate Requirements

To earn the Ascend Foundations Certificate (Year One), the following requirements must be met:

- Earn the number of credits the student has contracted for (minimum of 9)
- Successfully complete the Signature Leadership Course Certification by achieving a passing grade in the following classes:
 - Leadership Theory and Practice
 - Leadership and Management Communication
 - Leadership Learning and Execution
- Attend the following events:
 - APEX
 - Basecamp
 - Capstone
- Attend at least 8 Expert Webinars
 - Live attendance is required, but you may listen to a recording for 2 of the 8 if necessary
- Attend all team meetings unless you have an excused absence from your team leader.
 - Consistent absences will result in loss of certificate
- Complete Ascend Foundations Project
 - Demonstrate integration of principles into life, and demonstrate proficiency in core skills, through application in a personal project.



Process to a 4-Year Degree



So how does college work through the Ascend program? It's a fair question. For those students who enroll in Ascend on a degree-path, college is probably a pretty important part of why you're here.

Let's look first at an overview of our educational model and priorities. Then we'll walk through the process of what it looks like to earn credit through Ascend and ultimately graduate with your bachelor's degree.

1. Project-Based Higher Education

Ascend is a project-based higher education program, which means that the core of what we do is focused on helping you to translate your academic and nonacademic studies into practical, actionable steps that equip you for life. We believe you're called to greater things than most people settle for, that there are often better ways to learn those things than merely sitting in a classroom, and that your education should equip you for a life of impact. Beyond your academic classes, you'll also regularly hear from field experts in a variety of key disciplines, develop and hone crucial life and leadership skills, and apply everything you've learned in a significant Ascend Project.

Ascend is not in and of itself a degree-granting institution, but we serve as an effective liaison between you and your target school - helping you earn a fully accredited bachelor's degree at the pace you want while allowing you to pursue leadership, develop character, and build community.

2. Prior Credit

As with most higher education institutions, you'll share any unofficial transcripts with us before or during enrollment in Ascend. This allows us to determine how many credits you will be able to take before matriculating into your target school. If you have a lot of previous credit, you'll end up enrolling in your target school sooner than someone who does not have any credit.

3. Degree and School

If you don't already have a decision made, you'll work with our academic coaching team to choose a target degree and school. You are not restricted to graduating from one of our partner schools, although selecting one of these schools often provides a streamlined experience and typically offers maximum credit transfer and affordability. However, we can still support degrees offered from non-partner schools - just know that you'll probably be restricted in how much outside credit they will accept and how much flexibility you will have in the courses you can take.

4. Earning Credit

Once you've decided on the degree you want and the school you want to graduate from, Ascend will work with the partner of your choice to build out your full degree plan. This will

list all the courses you need to graduate with the degree you want from your target school as well as all the details about those courses. You'll also see how many courses you will take before matriculating into your target school.

5. Matriculation

Eventually, you'll have earned all the credit you can through Ascend, and it will be time to enroll in your target school! This process is often streamlined for our partner schools, and tuition is also discounted.

From this point on, you'll be taking classes (most often your upper division courses) directly from your target school. Unless you've elected to graduate with a residential degree, in which case you'll now move on-campus, these courses will still be online, but they will be specifically offered through your college.


Does this mean I am done with Ascend? Not necessarily. We hope you'll stay connected! Students who have matriculated into their target schools and have not completed all three years in Ascend are eligible to continue in Ascend, sans credit. These students participate in an Ascend Experience package that includes everything but their courses, and this allows them to continue building on their previous certificates.

If you opt to step out of Ascend, you can do so knowing that you're part of an alumni community that's now over ten thousand strong. And you're welcome to stay involved as much or as little as makes sense for you. We hope that before you leave, you'll invest some of your experiences and expertise in the next class of Ascend students and pass along some of the lessons of life and leadership you've gained along the way.

6. Graduation

After you've completed the remaining courses required for your degree, you'll apply for graduation! This process will also be conducted through your college. At this point, it's time for celebration! Many of our students choose to participate in their school's traditional graduation ceremony, but a vast majority also, or exclusively, choose to participate in Unbound's unofficial graduation ceremony held each year at APEX, alongside the fellow students they have come to know so well.

What if I don't want a degree? A college degree is not the main point of Ascend. Every year, students join Ascend and choose the non-degree path. These students complete the 9 credits of Signature Leadership Courses during their first year and then continue through their second and third years in Ascend without credit. As a non-degree Ascend student, you'll graduate with 1-4 high level certificates in leadership and professional development, 1-3 years of relevant, resume worthy experience in fields you are interested in, and a nation-wide professional network of 10,000+ alumni.



Why Choose a Partner School?



One decided benefit of Ascend is its flexibility - and the fact that you have the option to choose from hundreds of combinations of colleges and degrees. Ascend currently works with six different partner schools, but students are not limited solely to these colleges. If you are very interested in pursuing a specific degree from a particular school, Ascend can generally accommodate your choice.

That said, there are restrictions that you should understand as you consider different school and degree options. The number of credits - and the kind of credits - you can take prior to matriculation (enrollment) in your target school is based on that school's transfer policies. Some schools have very open credit transfer policies, while others do not. This means that if you choose a school with limited credit transfer, or a degree with significant residential requirements, the number of courses you will be able to take through Ascend will be similarly limited. Your cost per credit may also increase based on your chosen school's tuition rates.

Because of this, there are some significant benefits to choosing a partner school. Nearly all of Ascend's partner schools offer a significant tuition discount to our students, which helps keep your overall costs down. In addition, the admissions and transfer processes are often streamlined for Ascend students, and these schools' degree requirements are set up well to maximize the Ascend program. While there may be some exceptions to this, other institutions will not generally allow for as much of the Ascend program.

How to Enroll



So what does it look like to enroll in Ascend? In this comprehensive guide, you'll walk through the enrollment process and what happens afterwards as you approach your first semester.

Admissions

Ascend is a non-traditional education program and both the way we enroll students into the program and the way we run the program do not follow traditional university practices. We do not require applications but we do require conversations to ensure that we understand the student's goals and that the student understands the program before they join. Typically we find that 1 in 10 students are looking for the kind of challenging, non-traditional environment of Ascend and the rest are not interested. So what is your first step? Book an admissions appointment with our team. The number one goal on this appointment is to determine whether the Ascend program is a good fit for you and you are a good fit for the Ascend program. You'll talk through any questions you might have about Ascend that weren't covered in this eBook and talk through your academic, leadership, and professional goals. At the end of that call, your counselor will be able to tell you whether or not you would be a good fit for Ascend and determine what the best next steps are for you. If the next step is enrollment, our team will schedule an enrollment appointment for you to complete enrollment by submitting your deposit and scheduling your academic coaching call, if applicable.

Academic Coaching and Degree Planning

Once you've completed your initial enrollment, you'll begin the academic coaching process. In the enrollment form you will receive after your enrollment call with our admissions team, you will also complete a number of pre-academic coaching questions about your academic background, priorities, relevant personal or academic goals, and any additional pertinent information. This allows our academic team to build out a few initial recommendations for majors and schools that may be a good fit for your situation if you are pursuing a degree.

During your call, you'll discuss your options with an academic coach and work toward a final decision on your target school and major.

If needed, you and your academic coach will have a follow-up call to finalize your degree choice and target school. Once you have made this decision, your coach will submit your degree plan request to our academic partner, who will build out a full degree plan and course timing with credit transfer guarantees to your target school.

Once your degree plan is built and approved, you will receive access to your Student Dashboard and course list. When the semester begins, the courses you are taking will be unlocked.

After you've finalized your degree choice and target school, the start of the semester will be fast approaching!

Ascend Team Assignment

One to two weeks prior to the start of the semester, you will be assigned to your Ascend Team. Your team is a significant aspect of your Ascend Experience, and we can't wait for you to plug in with your fellow students!

Each team is comprised of seven to ten students and is led by a carefully selected ATL. Your ATL has already successfully completed at least one to two years of Ascend and has received significant deep training in mentoring and coaching. These teams meet on a monthly basis to discuss what they've learned from expert-led webinars, encourage each other in both school and life, and stay accountable for their goals. In addition, teams participate in a series of fun challenges throughout the course of the year and have the chance to complete group projects as well.

Because we believe deeply in the power of community and mentoring, your team will include both year one and year two students as often as possible. Instead of being on a team solely with students who are also new to Ascend, you'll have the benefit of coming alongside students who have already completed two rigorous certifications and are uniquely positioned to encourage and motivate you as you jump in.

Community

Your team is a pivotal aspect of Ascend, but it's not the only way to get plugged in! In fact, you've joined a student body with over ten thousand graduates and an active student body of over a thousand young adults. Are my courses from Christian perspective?

You can choose from a variety of course options in Ascend. All Ascend students begin their course of study with the Signature Leadership Courses, which are presented from a strong Biblical worldview perspective. Taught by Dr. Jeff Myers of Summit Ministries, these lay a deep foundation for what it truly means to be a leader of integrity.

For general education courses, students are typically placed by default into online courses offered through Bryan College. This university maintains a strong traditional Christian

perspective and their courses provide students with a Christocentric and high quality education.

Students who prefer a more flexible course option can take courses through Accelerated Pathways, a secular courses provider. These courses do not present a Christian worldview, but are entirely self-paced within an eight to sixteen week timeframe and offer busy students a flexible alternative.

If you have chosen a Christian school to graduate from, you will generally take a minimum of thirty credits directly from the school itself, and these will of course be offered from Christian perspective.

Does Unbound accept financial aid or issue 1098T Forms?

Because we are affiliated with schools but are not a college ourselves, we cannot take financial aid, scholarships, or tuition assistance directly. However, you are welcome to utilize available options at your discretion and use those funds to enroll in Ascend. Because we've all been students too, we're excited that our pricing structure is set lower than the average state school with tuition assistance!

They will be on a team of 7-10 other students led by an Ascend team leader. They will meet with their team on a video call once a month and engage online via the Slack chat platform throughout the rest of the month.

They will attend monthly expert-led webinars where they will learn from and ask questions of a variety of people based on the paths they've chosen for their education, profession, and ministry. These webinars are designed to expose students to a wide variety of fields, ideas, and principles.

They will attend three live student events where they will learn about the key concepts, principles, and tools needed for successful leadership, professional, academic, and personal development. They will put knowledge into practice through challenges and tasks designed to give them real-world experience through hands-on application.

They will conceive, plan, and execute a student project based on their individual interests and passions. This project can be completed solo, in partnership with other team members, or in partnership with others outside of Unbound. This project can be as simple or as ambitious as the student desires, but it must demonstrate the student's ability to take an idea and turn it into reality.

They will work through course materials and assignments to earn fully accredited and transferable college credit through specific online college courses based on their chosen major and target institution.
